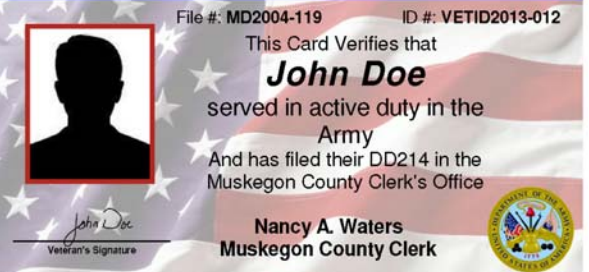

FREE VETERAN'S IDENTIFICATION CARDS

The veterans photo ID card will make it easier for veterans to get access to additional benefits and services, which may include discounts throughout the year and including free meals at many area restaurants on Veterans Day.

Clerk staff will take the veteran's photograph and obtain their electronic signature.

- ★ Military Discharge Papers (such as DD214) if not currently filed with County Clerk
- ★ Photo identification (such as a Michigan driver's license or Michigan ID card)

There will be a \$5 fee for replacement cards (cash, check, Visa or MasterCard)

The photo identification card is available to Muskegon County residents only and is the same size of a driver's license or state ID card.



Veterans may wear their hat to represent the branch of military in which they served.
